
My dear Sir,

to carry out -

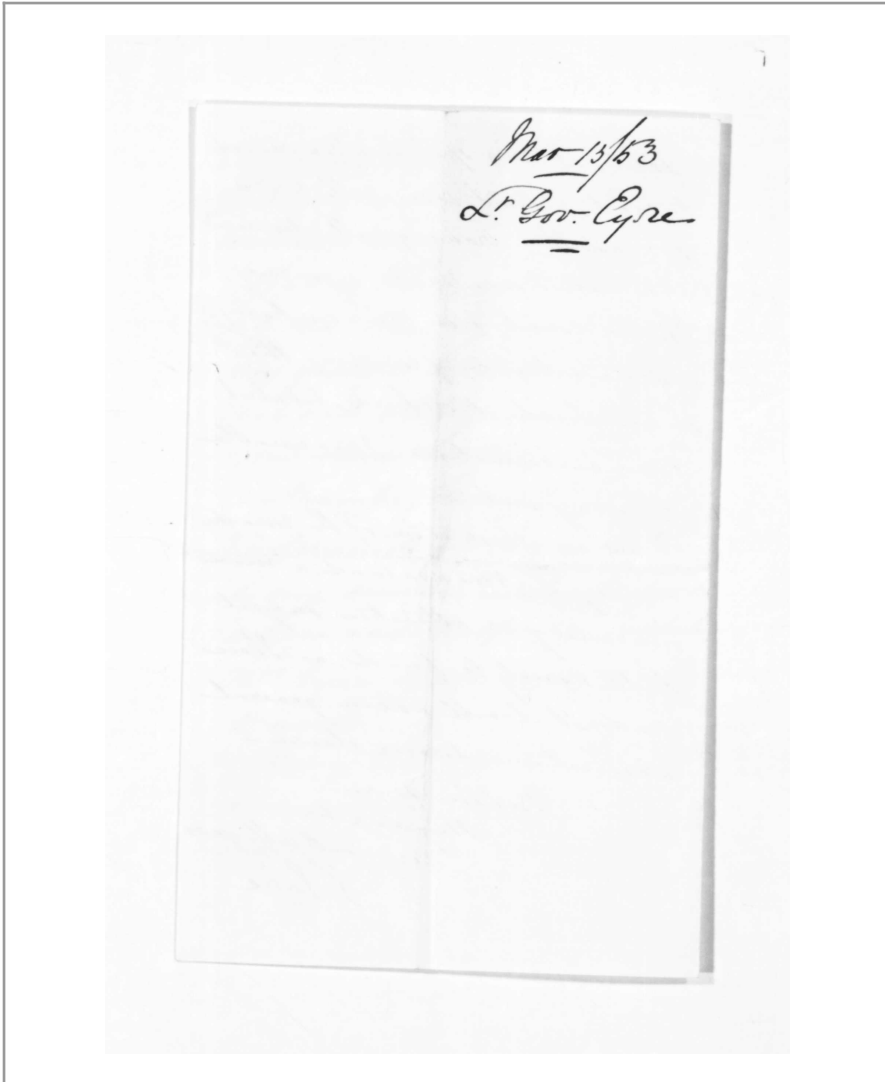
as an illustration of the romantic
