Sept. 11 1848.

My dear McLean,
Your letter addressed to Symonds
was opened by Mr Gillon a Native Secretary
but as he found it was on private matters
he gave it to me Symonds having left
for England - Before he left he appointed
Mr Beckham to receive & pay moneys for
him - your account however was not
mentioned and appears to have been
forgotten by Symonds - I have spoken
to Knight on the subject of these Wanganui
accounts and he thinks you are
fully entitled to ~~receive~~ your allowance
for travelling expenses during the
time you were engaged on the service
in question. I will copy what Knight
wrote on your letter "Mr McLean should
"present out of his travelling expenses
"for the whole time during which he coincides
"he was entitled to draw the customary
"allowance, & conclude on it the four
"shillings from Wanganui to New Plymouth

"He will of course arrange with Mr Seymour
 "on the of Mess Taylor's & Mait's bills & as they are to
 "be considered a private matter altogether".
 Knight says you had better make out the
 of £100 per diem, as if ^{they} ~~the~~ ^{things} ~~it~~ not be
 allowed it can be easily altered -
 After obtaining the amount of this of
 from Government you had better
 supply Mr Deokham with the sum of
 the sum which you think Seymour is
 indebted to you. - This week I hope
 will arrange this affair.
 You will have heard that I am about
 to leave the fort & join the Bishop - indeed
 I have already taken up my abode
 at the college. - Hence my writing more
 so I am much occupied - Remember
 me to all Friends & believe me
