



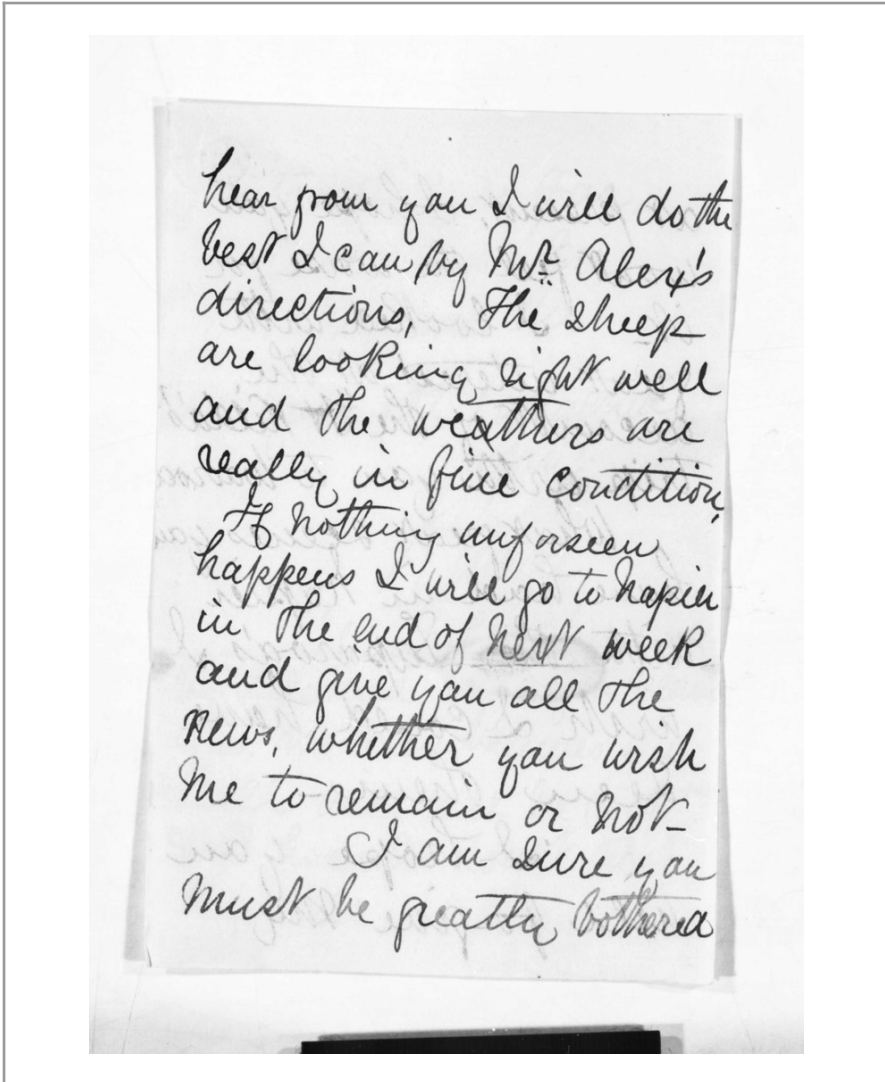
jobs at the stations, such

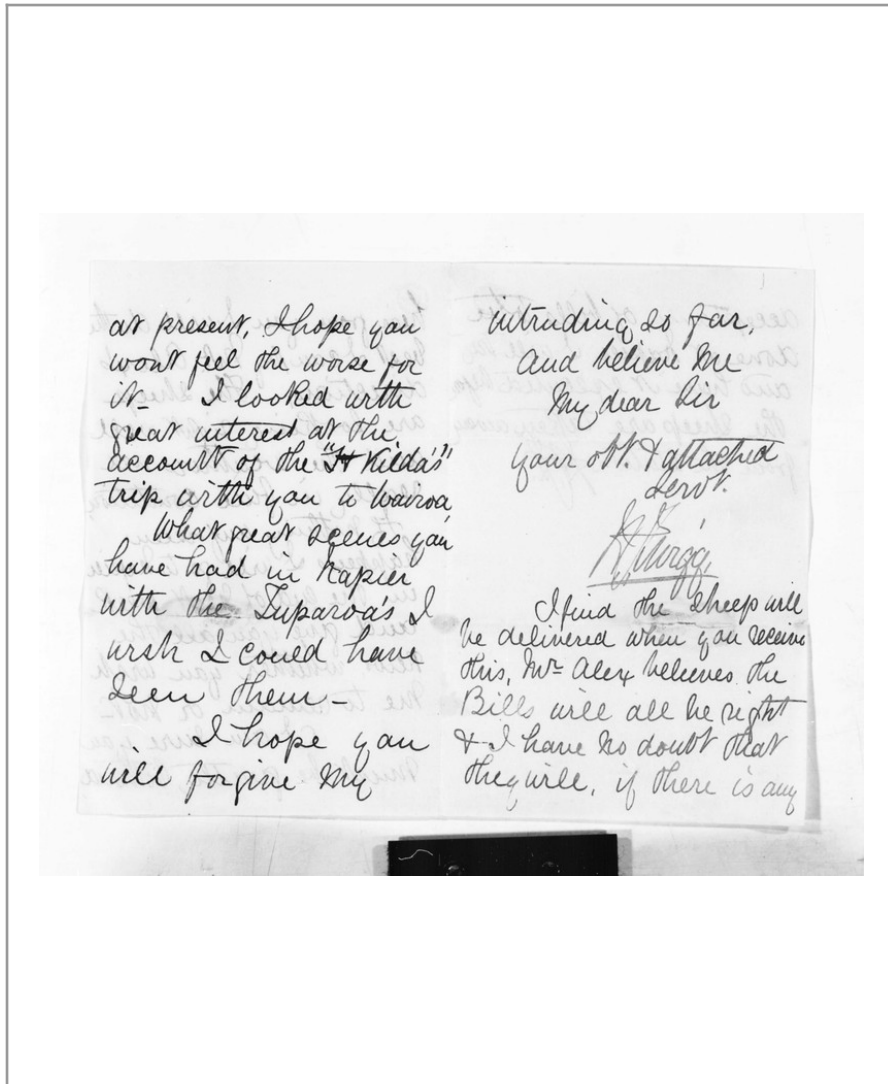
