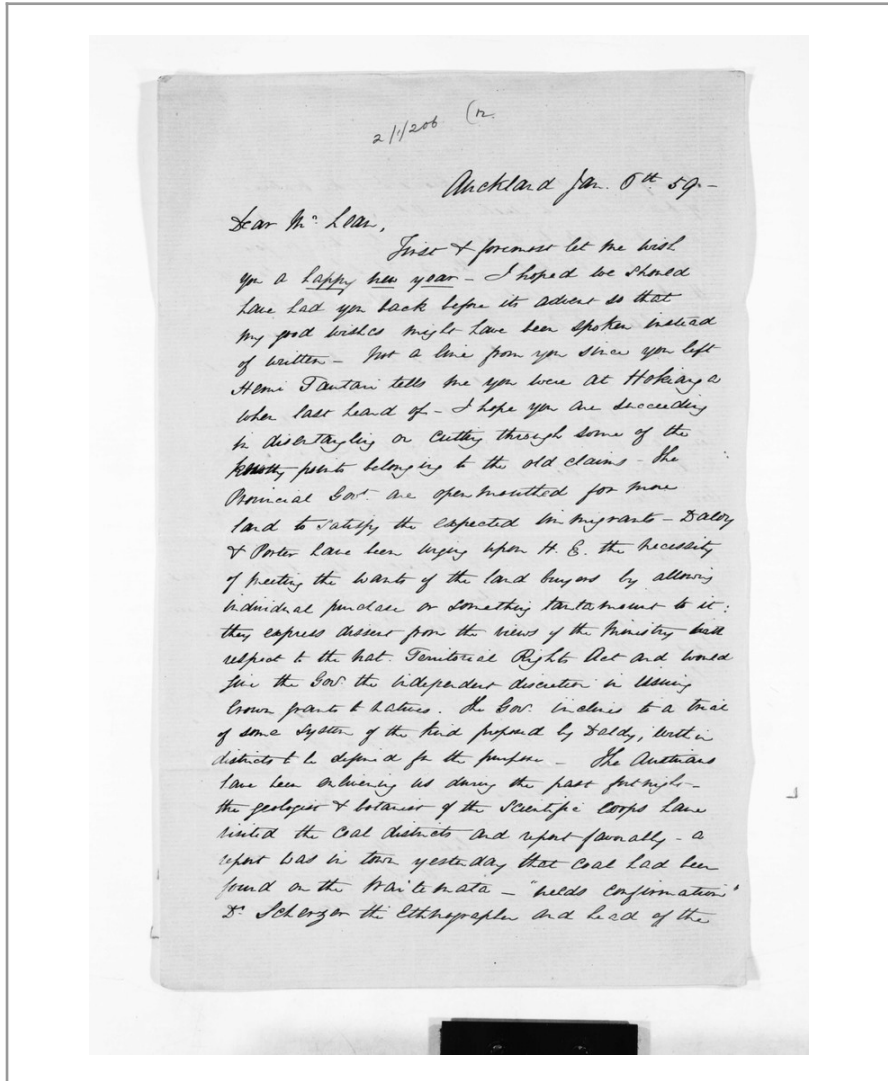
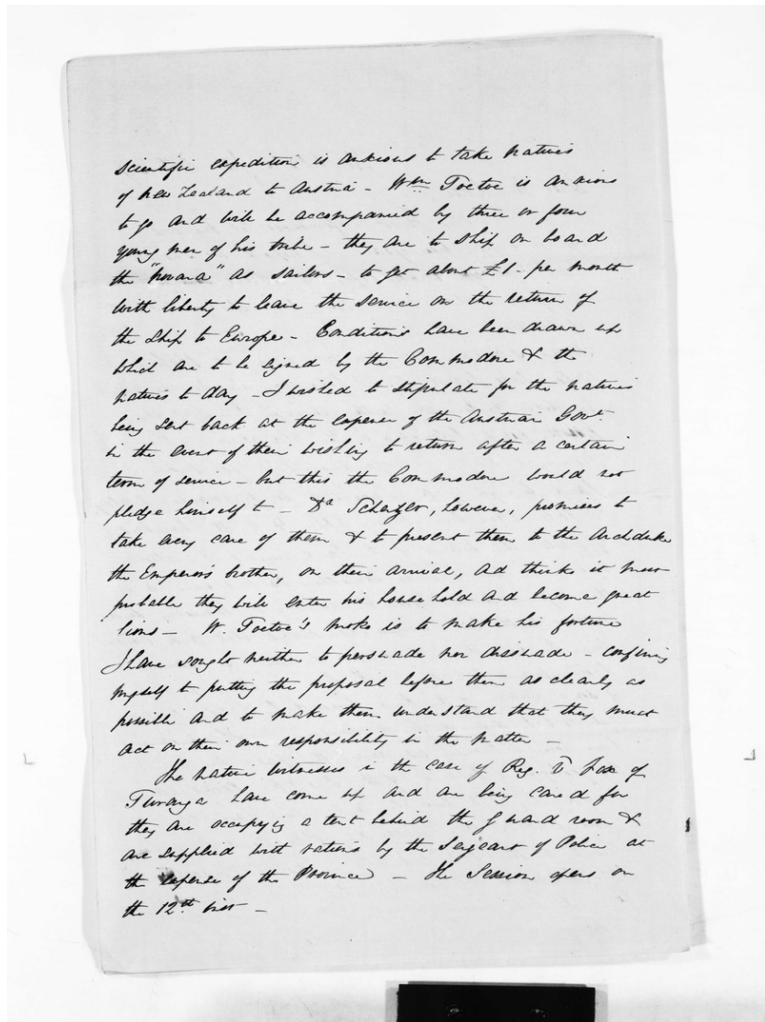

It seems De Alada is in town and is waiting
 to see the Gov. & yourself - he will return by
 the steamer to Taranaki - He states that the

 to be landed on to the "Amanga" - that if peace
 is brought about through the late conduct of the
 Chiefs who are on the side of the Gov. the land
 is to be sold - He also reports the sudden
 death of Hone Rapaha Mokea -
 The word of Rapaha seems to be left -

 for you to go down to Bay of Plenty is a chance of course
