

I am sorry to say
that I have not collected much

I have been the judge which I
 hope to see finished as soon as
 the weather will allow us to
 work - The natives of Te Aute
 are thinking amongst themselves
 the alleged cause being a dispute
 regarding the ownership of the
 land and ~~the~~ ^{the} being sufficient
 clear land in the neighbourhood
 of the settlement ~~the~~ the place
 Waipawa with a few others are
 gone to the Hauraki - Barrow
 to Ngawakatātara - The rest
 are divided between Patangata
 and Te Aute - I hear that it
 annoy Sir Williams very much -
 The Te Aute people are very
 anxious to bring up the old case
 dispute again - I have no doubt
 but you have heard all about
 these affairs long ago but I will
 endeavour to send more informa-
 tion next time.
