
Dear Mac

the land I want here with it -

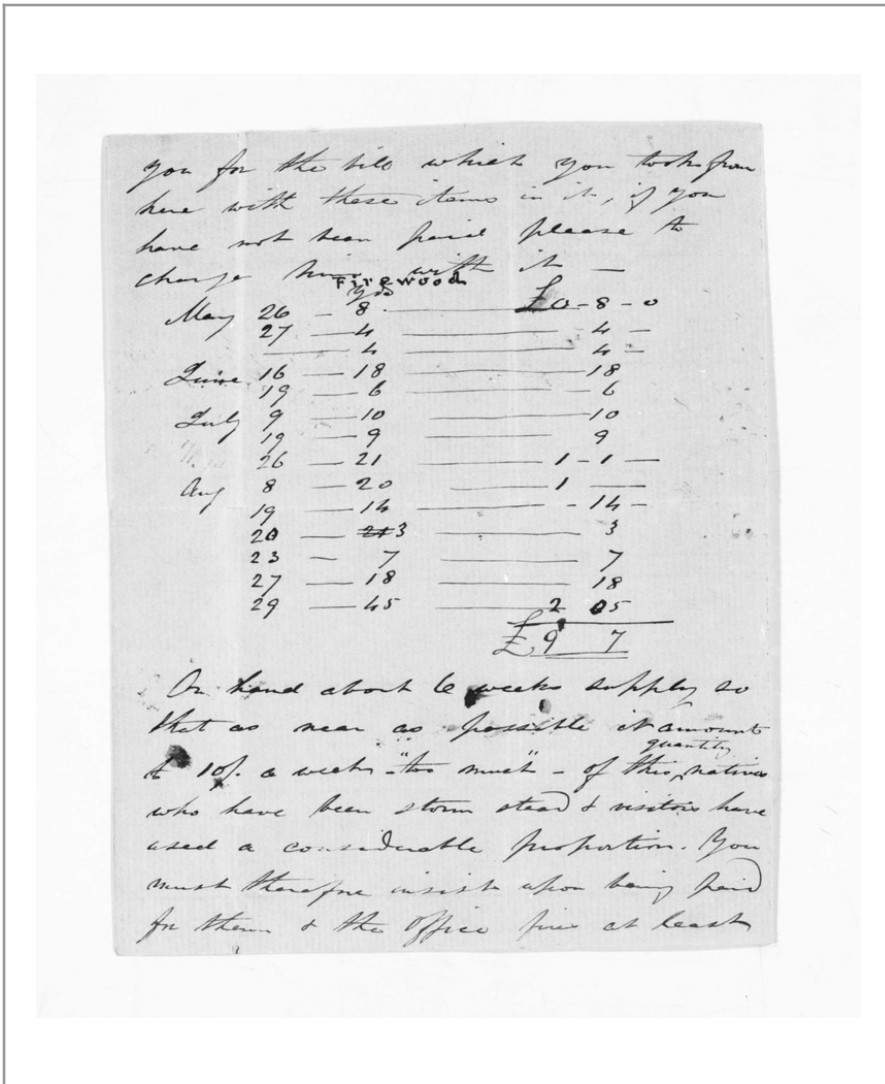

 are upon -

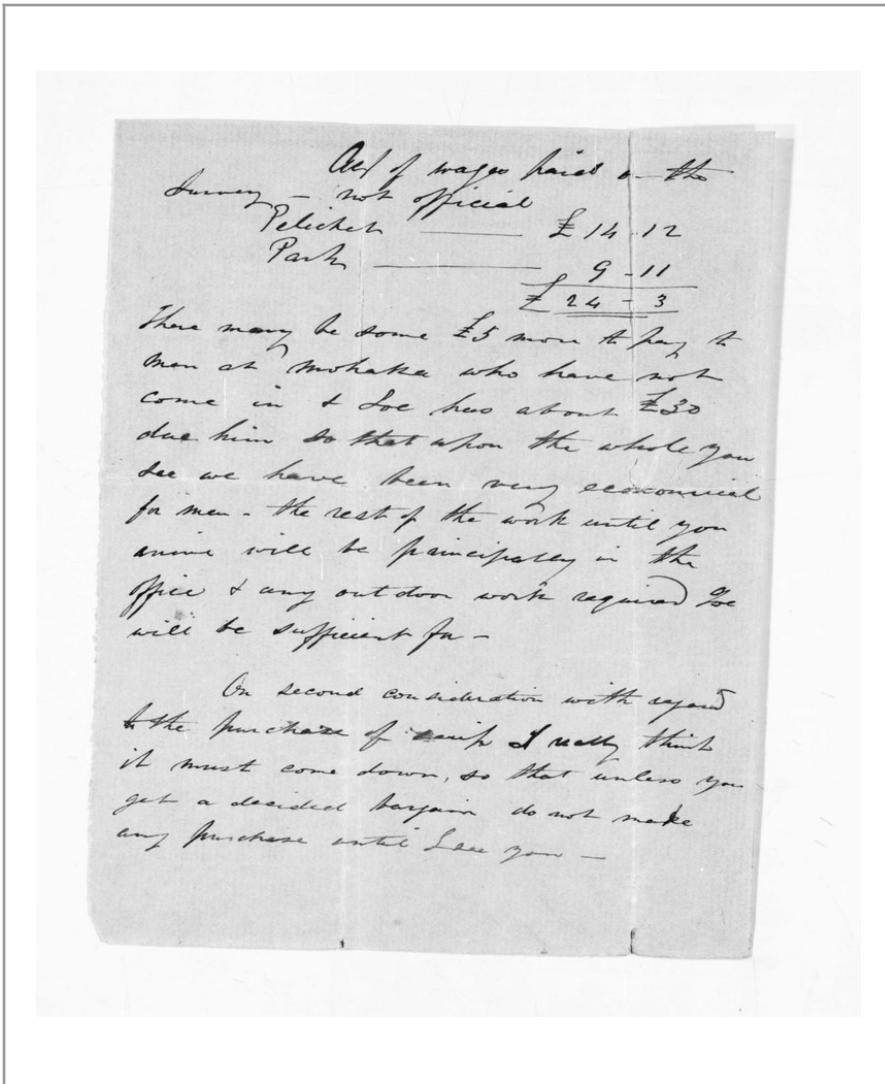
Below is a statement of the
