

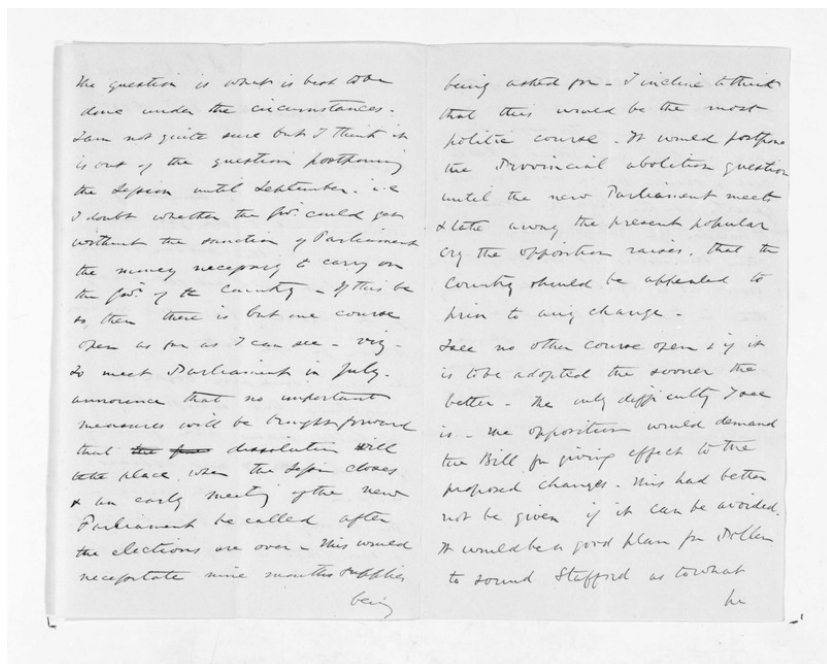
My dear Mr. Lean

to hear you are better -


The news about poor Vogel is
