

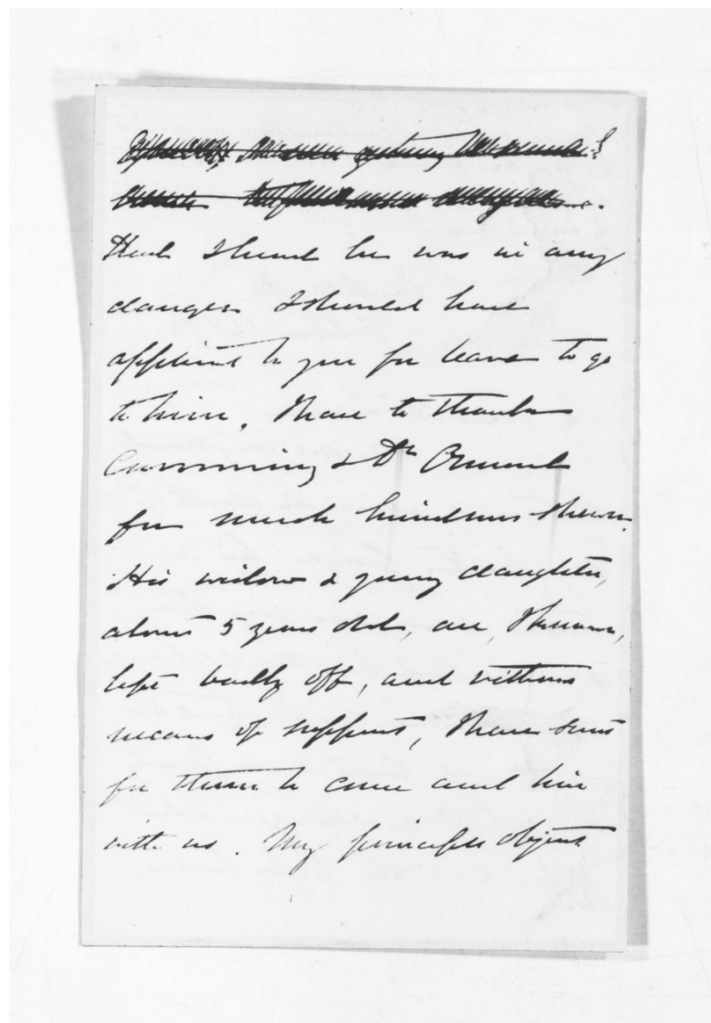


My dear Mr Leane,
