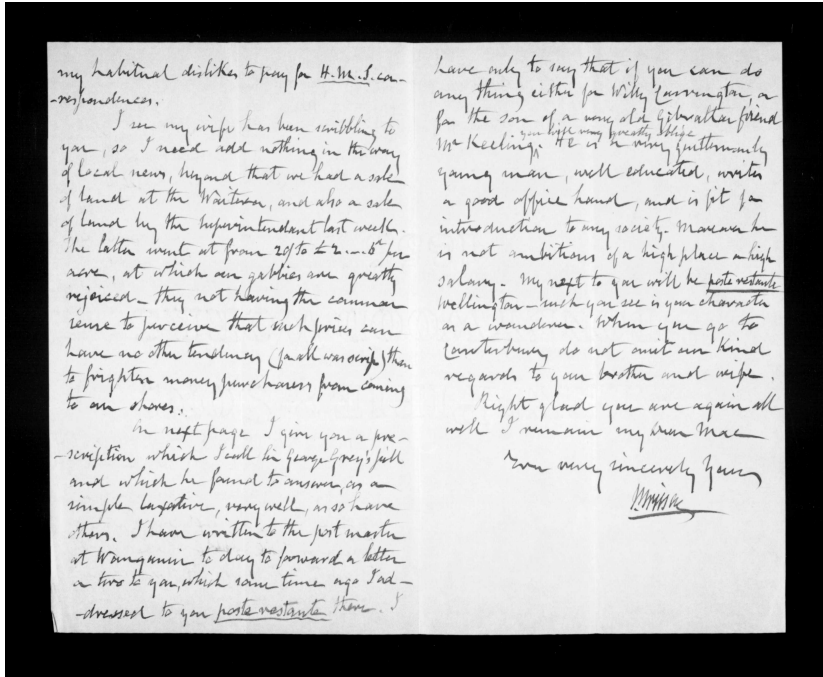
Monday 5 Dec<sup>r</sup> 1859 —

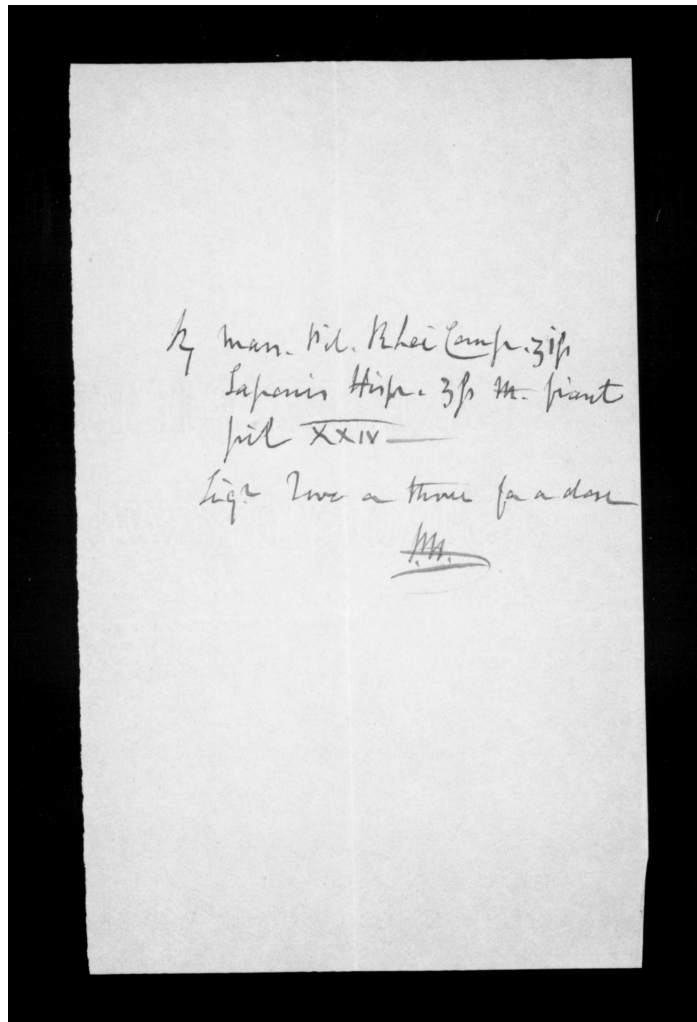

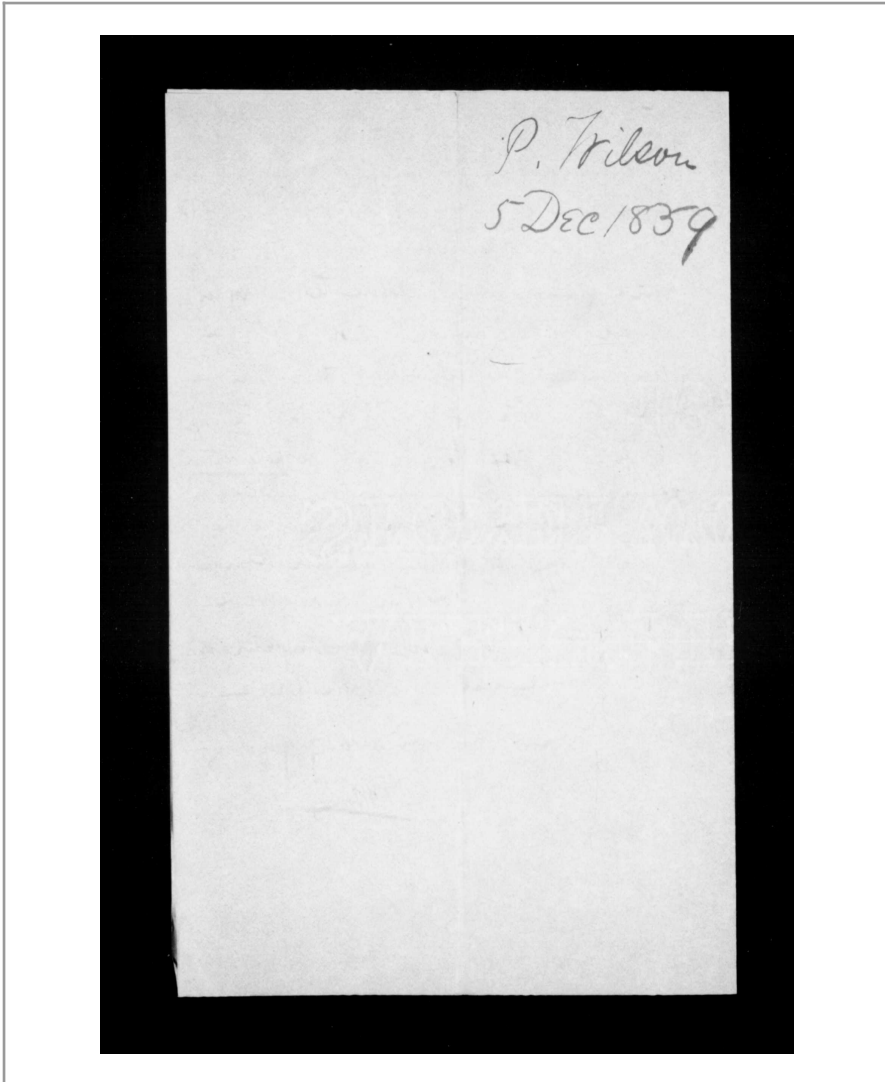
