Dunedin Monday Morning
19th Dec 1853

My dear McLean

I am quite concerned to learn that you have lately been so unwell, but trust that the proposed change to Canterbury, which I trust you intend making will see you upon your legs again as firm as ever.

Should you think of coming this way, I can only say it will afford me and mine much pleasure if you will but give the Drummond a fair trial of its restorative effects. I have also a little drop of Scott's Elixir life, which being genuine, might have a wonderful effect. If you do go to Christchurch remember me most kindly to your brother the Medical Officer.
